Campus Jottings

National Level Training Program for IFS Officers

A two days Training Program on 'Crafting Individuals as Effective Leaders' for Indian Forest Service Officers

was inaugurated by Prof. Sanjeev Jain, Vice Chancellor, Shri Mata Vaishno University, Devi Katra, Jammu on 19th May,2016. The program had participation from different parts of the



country including Odisha, Madhya Pradesh, Meghalaya, Uttarakhand, Delhi, Bihar, Rajasthan, Jharkhand, Gujarat, Punjab, Himachal Pradesh and Karnataka. In his Inaugural address Prof. Jain, Chief Guest of the event, welcomed the participants at SMVDU and highlighted the importance of this type of training programs as a source of valid and reliable leadership traits. He emphasized that the image of a leader drives people to do a said job and hones the ability of leader to do dynamic jobs as an original thinker and develops a contemporary image as a leader. He also highlighted the importance of social media and said that any leadership message today can spread within no time. He termed social media as an ocean and asked leaders to use these instruments in constructive directions. He urged leaders to use 360 degree span to develop a culture of learning for implementing government policies.

During these two days, training sessions on different topics including communications strategies for effective leadership, rational decision making process and leadership styles, motivating & influencing people, conflict management were conducted by resource persons from different reputed institutes including FORE Business School, New Delhi, Universal Business School, Mumbai, apart from experts/academicians from School of Business, SMVDU. Earlier, Dr. Jyoti Sharma, Head, Department of Business, while addressing the participants highlighted the importance of effective leadership for the society and termed them as agents of change and said that leadership quality can be developed through formal training like this to enhance effective communication skills, rational thinking and constructive attitude. Prof. V.K Bhatt, Dean, Faculty of Management also welcomed the participants from all length and breadth of the country and congratulated the organizing team and wished revered participants a safe and happy stay in SMVDU campus

Special Lecture on RTI Act

Prof. S.K. Sharma, Former State Information Commissioner, J&K delivered a special lecture on RTI Act of I&K on May 16, 2016 at Shri Mata Vaishno Devi University, Katra. In his address, he emphasised that the Act is meant to empower the citizens by way of ensuring transparency, accountability of the Government Departments and has been instrumental in curbing the corrupt practices of Government Employees. He presented various provisions of the Act before the audience and highlighted the differences between the RTI Act passed by the Parliament and J&K State. He said that the J&K RTI Act is superior to the Union Act in that the former makes provision for a time bound decision by the State Information Commission & also that the first appel-

late authority can recommend punishment to PIO by the Commission. Prof. Sharma emphasised the need of creating awareness regarding the Act among the people. He also suggested that regular orientation programs should be organized for the persons responsible for providing information as well as hearing appeals. While narrating his own experiences as the State Information Commissioner he opined that sometimes people are not judicious in seeking information, also that sometimes information providers seek to evade from their legal responsibility. We therefore must be very careful and responsible in exercising this Right, at the same time the officials should also be sensitive to the needs of the people.



First Philosophy Alumni Meet

The Department of Philosophy and Culture organized its first Alumni Meet on Thursday 5th May, 2016. On the occasion, Dr. Vandhana Sharma, Dean of the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences addressed the gathering and wished all the participants,

for their future endeavours. Dr. Varun K. Tripathi, Head, DoPC chaired the meet. Ms. Ruby Bharti ,Research Scholar presented a paper on "Irreducibility of Shabda-Pramana into Anumana with special reference to the Nyaya Philosophy", which was followed by a panel discussion in the seminar room of DoPC. Research Day Organized at the Department of Mathematics

The Department of Mathematics, Faculty of Sciences organized the 'Research Day' on 20th May, 2016. The coordinator of the pro-

gram Dr. Rakesh Kumar ,Assistant Professor greeted all the faculty members, research scholars and the students of M.Sc. Mathematics. He briefed the audience about the research progress made by the department in terms of the publications in journals and books, paper presentations in conferences, research projects, and the number of doctoral students guided during the last one year. He further deliberated on the research in mathematical sciences and the opportunities available after obtaining the research degree. Dr. A.K. Das, Head of the Department, acquainted the students of the



higher education channels available after M.Sc. Mathematics like M. Tech. and Ph.D. He briefed the students about the research areas where the faculty members were actively engaged. He also discussed about the various channels to get into the Ph.D. program in Mathematics in India, abroad and in particular, the Ph.D. programme entry process at SMVDU. He elaborated on the research problem formation, research methodology and the research plan and stressed on developing mathematical thinking. Prof. (Dr.) V. K. Bhat, Dean, Faculty of Sciences discussed about the interdisciplinary research in Mathematics and motivated the students to pursue higher education in Mathematics.

Dr. Kuldip Raj, Assistant Professor, emphasized that only hard working students should pursue Ph.D. in Mathematics. Dr. Surender Singh, Assistant Professor, advised the students to work with full dedication and honesty in whatever profession they adopt. He also wished a bright future to the outgoing batch. Dr. Sandeep Sharma, Assistant Professor urged the students to qualify competitive examinations like NET and GATE. One Week Workshop on "Financial Modeling using IBM SPSS"
