**Dr Jitendra Singh, Union Minister of State, Inaugurates 25<sup>th</sup> National Conference on e-Governance at SMVDU**



Inaugurating the 25<sup>th</sup> National Conference on e-Governance (NCeG), the silver jubilee edition of the NCeG at Shri Mata Vaishno Devi University, Dr Jitendra Singh, Union Minister of State (Independent Charge) said, the ultimate objective of good governance is to bring ease of living in the life of a common man. He further emphasized that under PM Modi directions, giant strides are being taken in the field of IT and new age technologies for better delivery of governance to citizens. Dr. Singh was speaking during 25th National Conference, organized by the Department of Administrative Reforms & Public Grievances (DARPG) and Ministry of Electronics & Information Technology (MeitY), Government of India, in association with the State Government of Jammu & Kashmir on 26-27 November, 2022.

Dwelling on the theme of the conference "Bringing Citizens, Industry and Government closer", Dr. Jitendra Singh said, this has become absolute necessity in the times we live in, as the days of working in silos is over. The Minister added that in an era of increasing digitization with Web 3.0, Artificial Intelligence and regular Tech Disruptions, Prime Minister Modi's vision of India's Tech aid can be realized through vigorous and all pervasive Digital push. The minister urged all the participants and stalwarts taking part in the two-day intense deliberations to focus on questions that will propel India to the next decade of agile growth. Dr. Singh presented the National Awards for e-Governance (NAeG) under 5 categories of the NAeG Scheme - 2022 to 18 e-Governance initiatives at Central, State and District levels, Academic & Research Institutions and Public Sector Undertaking. This includes 9 Gold and 9 Silver Awards in which e-Panchayat Mission Mode Project (eGramSwaraj and AayditOnline) of Ministry of Panchayati Raj was awarded the Gold under the category "Excellence in Government

Secretary, DARPG, Shri V. Srinivas in his address said that the policy maxim 'Maximum Governance, Minimum Government' is represented by a digitally empowered nation, a digitally empowered citizen and a digitally transformed institution. In the period from 2014 to 2022, government has brought about digital transformation which has been accepted by India's rural population through Jan Dhan, Aadhaar, UPI and Beam application, Arogya Setu App etc., the Secretary added. Chief Secretary, J&K(UT) Shri Arun Mehta in his address said that it is a proud moment for the UT of J&K for hosting 25th National Conference on e-Governance at Katra that shows signs of changes happening in J&K. J&K has achieved milestones in e-Governance with distinctions in implementation of Amrit-Sarovar, AKAM, PMGSY, Agriculture Income, ease of doing business, digitization of land records, providing land passbooks that has been possible through transparency, teamwork and technology, Sh. Mehta added. Secretary MeitY, Sh. Alkesh Kumar said that it's an occasion to recognize and showcase exemplary digital transformations brought out by Central Government, State Governments, Startup community, research and academic institutions. Additional Secretary, DARPG, Shri Amar Nath, Joint Secretary, DARPG, NBS Rajput, VC, SMVDU, Prof. R K Sinha and several senior officials of other departments and retired bureaucrats took part in the inaugural session.



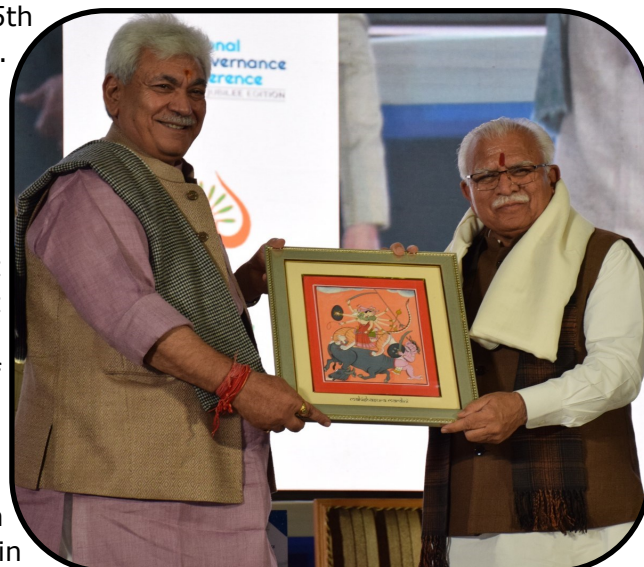
## 25<sup>th</sup> National Conference on e-Governance Concludes at SMVDU



Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha addressed the valedictory session of 25th National Conference on e-Governance at Shri Mata Vaishno Devi University. The event witnessed the launch of J&K Vision Document and J&K Cyber Security policy and a historic MoU between IT Department J&K and DITECH Haryana. The agreement between the J&K Government and Haryana Government is expected to strengthen and deepen the collaboration on knowledge sharing, IT initiatives & best practices in e-Governance, said the Lt Governor. In his address, Sh Manohar Lal, Chief Minister, Haryana, recalled his deep connection with Jammu Kashmir. I am witnessing a new, "badalta" Jammu Kashmir. We are looking forward to the new J&K-Haryana collaboration and committed to support J&K Government in meeting the goals, he said. Shri Manohar Lal highlighted the IT interventions and several digital initiatives of the Haryana Government to bring transparency in the system and streamlining the public service delivery system. Expressing his gratitude to the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Haryana Sh Manohar Lal; The Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology; Department of Administrative Reforms and Public Grievances, all the departments of the Central and State/UT Governments, the Lt Governor said that the 25th National e-Governance Conference in the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir will prove to be a milestone in the direction of fulfilling our resolve of Digital Society. Under the guidance of Hon'ble PM Shri Narendra Modi Ji, J&K UT is an emerging model of digital government with focus on transparent governance and citizen-centric approach to delivering public services, he said. Observing that



technology is making a real difference in people's lives, the Lt Governor said in 2013, the total number of e-transaction was merely 20 Lakh. This year, till 25th November, the number of e-transaction is 38.50 Crore. On an average J&K is recording 550 e-transactions every minute. Delivering efficient, effective, and accountable governance is our top priority. IT Department coordinating across the departments to ensure citizens interact and access information and services & provide feedback to improve service delivery, he added. The Lt Governor underscored that despite being a late entrant in digital transformation, J&K has achieved several milestones with solid technical architecture at the service of citizens. Speedy development is the new identity of J&K, he said. The Lt Governor further observed that the launch of Digital J&K Vision Document and launch of J&K Cyber Security Policy will promote a common approach to use the power of innovation and secure the IT assets in the rapidly changing technology landscape. Speaking on the digital transformational journey of Jammu and Kashmir, the Lt Governor shared the vision of the J&K government to expand e-Governance to the next level.



We have prepared a roadmap and action plan for the next one, three & five years. More than 500 services will be made online in the next 3 years for a better digital delivery ecosystem, said the Lt Governor. Line to online is our prime objective and instead of traveling to Government offices, people just need to walk to the web, he added. Our strategy is to enable the people to access high-quality services anywhere, anytime, on any device. All services in mobile for mobile workforce, the Lt Governor said. We are also working on the development of IT infrastructure; technology-led market linkages; encouraging emerging concepts like use of AI in Agriculture for welfare of farmers; layered Public Grievances; use of Metaverse (for Global Tourism) etc, the Lt Governor further added. The Lt Governor noted that initiatives like e-Office, BEAMS-Empowerment, Aapki Zameen-Aapki Nigrani, AapKa Mobile Hamara Daftar, e-Unnat, Digi Locker, Meri Pehchaan has established accountability and transparency in governance. Digital J&K Internship scheme for Youths has been started which will provide an opportunity for a student to secure first hand and practical work experience in the IT sector, he added. Several digital initiatives of the Rural Development Department have empowered grassroots democracy. In the recently concluded Back to Village program, 3 lakh villagers accessed various government services online which reflects increased trust of the citizens, the Lt Governor further added. The Lt Governor also invited suggestions from all stakeholders to build a better digital ecosystem in the UT of J&K. Sh Sanjeev Kaushal, Chief Secretary, Haryana; Dr Arun Kumar Mehta, Chief Secretary J&K; Sh V Srinivas, Secretary, DARPG and Ms. Prerna Puri, Commissioner/ Secretary to J&K Government, Information Technology Department also spoke on the occasion and shared their views and the positive impact of the National Conference on e-Governance and initiatives taken during the Conference in bringing Citizens, Industry and Government closer. On the occasion, J&K Government also signed MoUs with Shri Mata Vaishno Devi University and National Institute of Electronics & Information Technology (NIELIT) for capacity building of the youth and collaborations in the IT sector. ## ICC SMVDU Conducts Awareness Lecture

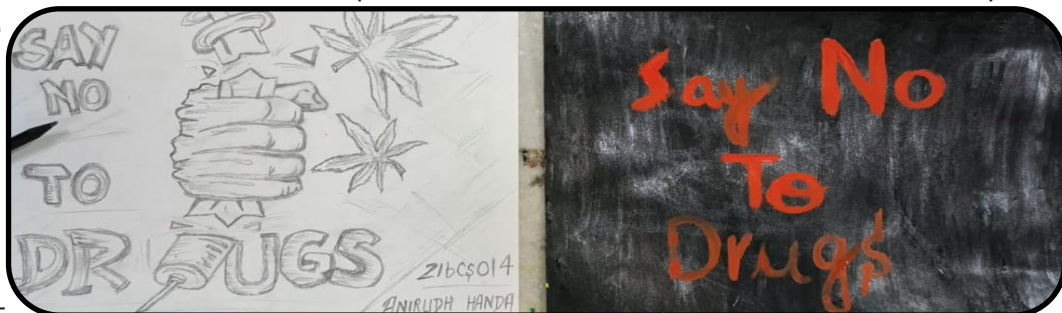

The paper explains how diverse endophytic bacteria can serve a role in natural product drug-discovery for novel anti-microbials to combat the multi drug resistant infections and their metabolites. Dr. Sharda presented a lecture on Vitro Manipulation for Production of Plant Secondary Metabolites; Mr. Amit Kumar Choudhary, Ph.D. Scholar, Biotechnology made a poster presentation on "Importance and Conservation of Critically Endangered Medicinal Flora in Kashmir Himalayan Biodiversity Hotspot, Jammu and Kashmir".

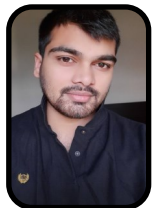
## SMVDU Students Visit Bullet Train Project Site & Statue of Unity, Gujarat

## SMVDU Researcher Declares Qualified for the Award of PhD

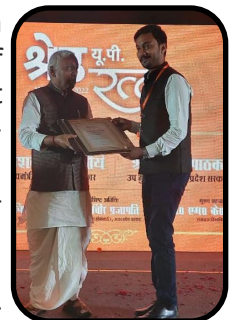
